

NO TEACHER IS REQUIRED TO FUND UNION POLITICAL CAUSES YOU CAN PROTECT YOUR PAYCHECK!

State law in Washington and Oregon allows mandatory union representation fees as a condition of employment. Nonunion employees have court-provided options, however, to protect themselves from funding nonrepresentational union activities such as political organizing and contributions. GET MONEY BACK! \$200-\$300 UNION DUES REBATE

Nonunion teachers or "agency fee payers" can object to paying full dues and can request a union rebate for nonrepresentational expenditures. The annual rebate is approximately \$200-\$300.

To receive the union dues rebate, nonunion teachers must request it <u>every year</u> by the state association's deadline. If the deadline is missed, you will not receive the rebate and your representation fees will fund the union's political contributions and activities.

DUES FOR CHARITY RELIGIOUS OBJECTOR OPTION

A religious objector is an individual of faith who refuses union membership for reasons of conscience. If the union's activities violate your sincere moral and religious beliefs, you may send the equivalent of your dues to a charity. You may also receive a charitable contribution deduction for donating their dues to charity.

To obtain religious objector status, you must write a letter explaining your religious objection to the union. Once approved, you do not have to renew your status each year. There are no deadlines to request religious objector status.
